Annual Report
July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017

The most important indicator of improved student achievement is ongoing teacher growth and improvement. A positive and growing teacher generates enthusiasm for learning and plants the seeds which germinate in students and produce a harvest of life-long learning.

For more than thirty years the Lakeview Schools has invested in teachers and school district staff through grants to enhance their ability to effectively engage students in their own learning. LSEF has also provided scholarships to students as they move beyond the district to continue their own learning.

During 2016/2017 LSEF provided a total of \$35,215—
\$3,785 to teachers in grants
\$28,250 in scholarship for post-secondary education
\$3,180 to students to attend sports camps

The primary focus of the LSEF Board in the current year will be on fund development—marketing and increasing donations. Our goals for this year are to:

1. Increase new donations to \$50,000 which was a 5% increase from the 2016 year. In fact last year we received \$35,426. So, the goal is 40% higher than 2017. Challenging...
2. Establish two (2) new funds with a combined additional value of \$25,000 (included in above, overall goal).
3. Document Board member activities to solicit donations or establish new funds.
4. Complete the communications and marketing plan and implement at least two (2) activities related to the plan by November 15, 2018

While our scholarship and grant activities continue the LSEF Board will primarily focus on fund development and marketing. We invite the Lakeview staff, families and community to join us in these efforts.
